History

The Arizona Interagency Farmworkers Coalition (AIFC), a non-profit, community-based service organization, was founded in 1991. The Coalition formed in response to a need to coordinate fragmented services from multi-disciplinary agencies and organizations. AIFC was originally housed and coordinated through the Arizona Alliance for Community Health Centers in efforts to support Migrant Health Centers. Today, AIFC is an independent 501(c)3 non-profit organization.

AIFC has two central purposes today:

1. Provide scholarships to children in Arizona agricultural worker families to assist with college.
2. Organize a yearly educational conference for all entities providing services to Arizona agricultural workers.

Participation
