## Who can apply for Unemployment Benefits

- Any individual can apply for unemployment benefits. It is each person's right and due process as a citizen and lawful resident of the United States.
- There are Monetary and Eligibility Requirements that one must meet before benefits can be paid






# How to file for Unemployment Benefits

There are three ways that an individual can file for benefits:

- >ONLINE
- >MAIL
- In person claims taken in Somerton & San Luis offices only






#### To apply by internet

# Initial claims are no longer accepted by phone

Claimants can call Arizona Reemployment Rapid Access (ARRA), at these local numbers for questions regarding their claim.

# ARRA Call in schedule has been implemented:

If the claimant's social security number ends with

- 1, 2 or 3 calls are accepted on Monday
- 4, 5 or 6 calls are accepted on Tuesday
- 7, 8 or 9 calls are accepted on Wednesday
- 0 calls are accepted on Thursdays

Friday is open for anyone to call If the assigned day is a holiday, call on Friday.



# Important to remember when filing for benefits

- ❖ A claim for benefits is effective the week in which it is filed.
- A claimant is encouraged to file for benefits the same week their separation occurs.
- The Department bases all decisions on Federal and State Laws, Rules, and Policies.



#### How much can you get?

- In Arizona, Unemployment Insurance is based on wages earned during the base period. The maximum weekly award is \$240 per week.
- Minimum weekly benefit amount is \$122 per week and the maximum is \$240 per week, for up to 26 weeks (6 months) unless there is a special extension.
- Benefit amount is determined by wages earned during the "Base Period".
- The first week of unemployment during which you meet all eligibility requirements is the waiting week. The waiting week is not a payable week.



#### Monetary Requirements

- Monetary eligibility for unemployment insurance is based on insured wages paid during a one year period called *the base period*.
- The base period will be the first four of the last five completed calendar quarters prior to the date someone first applied for unemployment insurance.
- The calendar year is divided into four calendar quarters

■1st quarter

Jan 1 - Mar 31

■2<sup>nd</sup> quarter

Apr 1 - Jun 30

■3<sup>rd</sup> quarter

Jul 1 - Sept 30

4<sup>th</sup> quarter

Oct 1 - Dec 31



#### BASE PERIOD



EXAMPLE: If a claim for benefits is filed in April 2013, the BASE PERIOD would be the 1st Quarter of 2012 through the 4th Quarter of 2012.



## Monetary Eligibility continued

To qualify for benefits, wages must have been paid in *insured employment* of:

✓ At least 390 times the Arizona minimum wage in effect at the time the claim is filed (currently \$7.90 an hour x 390 = \$3042.00.) The total of the other three quarters must equal at least one half of the amount in the high quarter.

OR





## Monetary Eligibility continued

✓ At least \$7000.00 in total wages in at least two quarters of the Base Period, with wages in one quarter equal to \$5987.50 or more.

If the claimant does not meet these requirements, then his or her claim will be **MONETARILY INELIGIBLE** and benefits will not be paid.





#### Claimant's Responsibilities

- US Citizen or Lawfully Permitted to work in the US
- > Able to work
- Available to work
- Actively seeking work (work search contacts must be submitted each week)
- Employment Service Registration (<u>www.azjobconnection.gov</u>)
- Certify that she or he has read and understood <u>A</u>
  Guide to Unemployment Insurance Arizona Benefits



#### Eligibility Requirements

#### Who is eligible to receive Unemployment Benefits?

- Claimants who:
  - •Are out of work from their most recent employer due to no fault of their own
  - •Who are able to work and available for work each regular workday
  - •Who are actively seeking work each week they file for benefits







#### New Work Search Requirements

Actively seeking work – Individuals must make an active and continuous effort to seek work each week that benefits are claimed. An active work search means:

- Individuals must engage in a systematic and sustained effort to obtain work during at least four different days of the week and you must make at least three work search contacts during the week.
- Work search should include the usual methods of obtaining work that individuals are suited for by experience, education and/or training. An adequate search for work is a sincere, consistent effort, and is not just an attempt to remain eligible for benefits.

## New Work Search Requirements

- Keep a record of all work search contacts made each week that a claimant files for benefits.
- Individuals will be required to provide this information when they file a weekly claim. Keep the following information on each employer: the date of contact, company name and address, the name of the person contacted or website visited, the method of contact, the type of work sought, and the results.
- Failure to make an adequate search for work will result in a disqualification from benefits for the duration of his or her unemployment.
